## Rally O

Thank you to Diane and Rosie who have put together a fun competition known as Rally O. The aim of this is to complete a set obedience course with your dog completing a series of exercises. All competitors start with the same number of points, and points are deducted for missed exercises. The handler and dog with the highest score wins. There will be two competition levels – Open and Novice. All Instructors and Advanced Class members will have to compete in the Open Section. All other members can compete in Novice.



One of the advantages of this type of game is that the exercise you have to do will be clearly described at each "station". For example if you go to the first station it will have a clear notice describing the required exercise, for example SIT. You will not have to remember what to do next, there will be a notice telling you what to do! (Picture shows an example of what a "station" might look like). I have been asked to judge this event, which will be a first for me too. It sounds a lot of fun, so we hope for lots of entries on the day.

## Award Presentations

Perpetual trophies - The Anne Cook Award for the Most Improved Handler Overall and the Peter Smith and Jimmy Award for the Most Persistent Handler will be presented, together with awards for the Best or Most Improved in the various Club classes, Agility and Flyball. The Club's Obedience and Agility Perpetual Trophies, which were decided through our annual competitions, will also be presented to the winners.
