It is certainly a very busy time for us all with our dogs. Thank you to everyone involved in The Margaret Rudd Agility Competition which commenced on 8th May, and congratulations go to Louise with Darcy, winner of the first course. Subsequent events will be held on the 17 July; 11 September and 13 November. The 31st July is the date set for the Club Championships, which are the President's Trophy, the Marion Mann Trophy and the Lyn Brookes Trophy.

Our Club is celebrating the fantastic achievement of the Mudd on the Paws Division Two Flyball Team with their win at the National Championships held in Sydney over Easter. Over two days of competition the team won all sixteen races, although some with only 100th's second margin. It was

exciting racing! The team also won the Maggie Trophy for being the best team in Division Two. The winning streak did not end there though, Louise Hamilton and Darcy won first place in the singles event, with Rosie Milton and Pac coming second. In the Veteran's competition for dogs over seven years of age, a team with several members from Mudd on the Paws won the Division Two competition. We now have so many trophies a shelf is going to be built in the Clubhouse so they can be appropriately displayed! A wonderful achievement for a team which only came together in 2009, well done everyone.

As part of our ongoing commitment to keep up to date with current dog training methods, Rosie Milton is taking an on-line course run by Canadian Dog Training Expert Susan Garrett. The course content is being shared with other

Club instructors and over coming months will be incorporated into obedience training classes. These training methods concentrate very much on the importance of having your dog's focus on you through a series of fun games.

MUDTC Club Championships

This year's Club Championships will be held on Sunday 31 July. There are three separate Trophies.

The President Trophy is for less experienced dogs and the exercises are performed on lead. This year the exercises are:

- Obedience heeling pattern – on lead
- Sit, drop, sit at the end of the lead
- Restrained Recall
- Jump, tunnel, jump (handler runs with their dog)
- 1 minute sit stay – on lead
- Rally O – 6 – 8 Stations

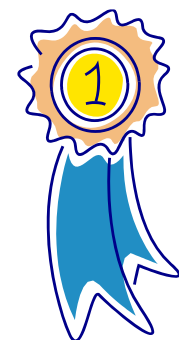
A total of 200 points

The Lyn Brooks Trophy (Medium/large dogs) and the **Marion Mann Trophy** (Small Dogs) is for the more experienced dogs and exercises are performed off lead. The exercises are:

- Obedience heeling pattern – off lead
- Drop on recall
- 2 dummy retrieve
- Jump, tunnel, jump and fetch dumbbell
- 1 minute sit out of sight
- 1 minute drop out of sight
- Jumping

A total of 200 points

Please talk to your Instructor now if you plan to take part in any of the



competitions so you can start practicing the various disciplines as soon as possible.

More Success at Competitions

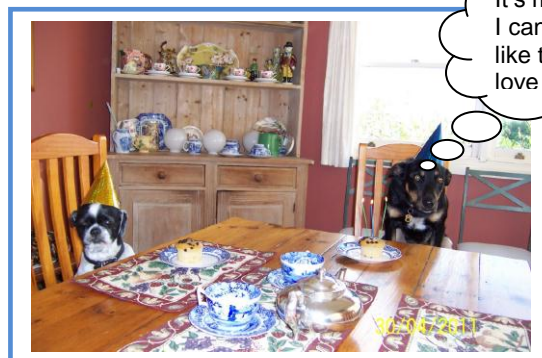
